The Ranger College baseball team would have to wait all week to get back on the field following their loss to Hillsborough Community College last Sunday in Tampa, Florida. However, once the Rangers were able to take the field again, they did so with a vengeance. Coach Norwood's team jumped out ahead early putting 6 runs on the scoreboard in the first inning. The Rangers would not look back as they would go on to defeat Galveston College 16-2 yesterday afternoon.

The Lady Rangers softball kicked off their homestand with a double-header against Midland College on Tuesday. The match-up was pushed up due to the impending Winter storm. Despite a healthy crowd of Rangers in the stands the Lady Rangers would drop the double-header but hopes to rebound this week.

Both basketball teams are in the middle of their conference schedules and both hosted visiting Temple College on Saturday in Ron Butler Gymnasium. Coach Laurent's Lady Rangers dropped a tightly fought battle with Temple 68-72 while coach Brown's Men's Basketball team went on to defeat Temple. The win for the men improves their conference record to .500 and overall record to 14-8.

High Achieving Rangers on the Field of Play and in the Classroom

These students carry a full-time course load, attend required team study halls, practice at least 2 hours per day, and log many hours traveling from city to city to compete.
