The two-game set was moved up from Wednesday to Monday in preparation for the impending Winter storm. The Apaches, winners of 8 of their 12 games in the month of February, were able to get up early on the Lady Rangers and coast to victory in both games.

Ranger basketball regular season had to wait all week for the season finales. The Lady Ranger basketball team, riding a hot streak of 5-straight wins, traveled to Collin County Community College. Collin County defeated the Lady Rangers by 3 at Ron Butler Gymnasium in the final game in the month of January. And for the second time this season, Coach Laurent's team would not be able to add to their 5-game winning streak dropping 68-62 to Collin County.

Coach Brown's Ranger basketball team entered their season finale with a 15-12 record. The Rangers faced Collin County who came into conference play undefeated but has since suffered their only losses of the season in conference play. The Rangers would lose the season finale on Saturday afternoon dropping 5 straight games to end the season.




Lady Ranger Women's Basketball T-Shirt Sale
