Weekly Ranger Athletics Recap

The week in Ranger College Athletics was highlighted by performance of the Ranger Men's and Women's Track & Field Teams. Coach Chris Zent had four men compete and three women across ten events, with PR's or season bests in all but two events. Shelton Bass broke 50 seconds in the 400m, running the fastest time at Ranger since bringing back track and field - 49.71 (new PR), and 22.86 in the 200. Others with PR's include Chase Leatherwood in Javelin (47.15m - big PR), Adrian Reyes (16:18.15 in the 5000), Allen Price (4:30.68 in the 1500), and Nevaeh Sarabia in the 1500 (5:22.52). Purity Chelagat also added a 2nd place in her heat in the 1500 for a 5:10.52 finish.

The Ranger College Track & Field teams will be in action two weekends from now at the Masked Rider Invitational at Texas Tech.

In other athletic news, the Ranger Baseball and Softball teams clashed in 4-game series this week against Weatherford College. The Lady Rangers came up short in their outings versus the Coyotes, despite a valiant effort by the team and coaching staff. The Ranger Baseball team would take 3 out of 4 versus the Coyotes who came into the series ranked 17th in the country.
