Solid Rock Christian Camp has been hosting 70-80 out of town emergency personnel nightly for the past several days. Many had to sleep on fire stations floors as local hotels were completely sold out but were so grateful to learn the camp was going to open up to them. The camp is also providing hot meals when they are back on site and snack packs to take with them for the day as they don't know when they will return to the camp for their next meal.

Student Support Services (S3) had 5 students volunteer to help fill lunch/snack packs for the working firefighters/emergency personnel and volunteers out in the field. The lunch/snack packs were also given to displaced homeowners working on sifting through rubble and others in Carbon who have no electricity or water. They contained non-perishables such as jerky, crackers, chips, cookies, etc. The gesture was greatly appreciated by those who had no time or facilities for meals. All in all, the students spent several hours at the camp, and they packaged a few hundred bags, helped load and unload food and supplies and got to drive on a golf cart to the camp dorms to add toiletry items to the new firefighters coming in from out of town. There are an estimated 500-700 emergency personnel and volunteers in our county from out of town now, so any help they can get is greatly appreciated!
