

In preparation for the Spring baseball season, Coach Norwood's team wrapped up Fall this past week. In addition to preparing the team for the season, the field has undergone some cosmetic work. The photo of Ellis Burks' Field was taken this week with a beautiful Texas sky overlooking our beloved Ranger, Texas.

In basketball news, the Men's and Women's Ranger teams traveled to Midland, Texas this weekend. Coach Laurent's Lady Rangers arrived in Midland on Thursday to face off against the host school, defeating MC 51-47. On Friday afternoon, the Lady Rangers let a second-half lead slip away as they fell to Dodge City CC 74-83. However, the Lady Rangers bounced back in a big way Saturday afternoon defeating the Coyotes of Chandler-Gilbert CC 84-45. Freshman Guard, Deandra Allen, tallied a double-double scoring 17 points and adding 10 rebounds.

On the men's side of the Midland Classic, the Rangers squared off against New Mexico Military Institute on Friday afternoon. At the start of the second half, the Rangers came out of the locker room trailing 43-44. However, coach Cox's team buckled down defensively in the second half getting out in the passing lanes, getting deflections, and stepping in to take charges. Cincere Scott provided 15 points off the bench, giving the team a spark propelling them to a 90-74 victory. To wrap up the weekend of hoops, the Rangers took on the host and undefeated program, Midland College. The game came down to the wire with both teams trading baskets. Unfortunately, in the end, the Rangers would not have enough down the stretch and would lose a tough fought road game.



This weekend, members of the Ranger College Cross Country team participated in the NJCAA National Championship in Tallahassee, Florida. The Ranger team placed 18th overall out of 29 teams. The student-athletes that qualified for the Men's 8k Division I Run were Dai'mond Harvey (92), Nathan Ford (101), Chris Jimenez (113), Emiliano Mejia (118), and Giovani Campos (123). Coach Chris Sepulveda said, "these guys showed a lot of determination all year despite the obstacles they faced."
