After we all had a good laugh, they sent us home with hams. Now, I know what you are all thinking? Hams? Yes, and it was delicious.


The moment that the ham was handed to me was the funniest part because I turned around and I asked Cortney, "what am I supposed to do with this?"

As part of our International Year, this week we are celebrating Ramadan. While not part of a specific country's culture, it is celebrated by 24% of the world population. Ramadan is based on the lunar calendar, so the dates are different every year. For 2023 it is from March 22 through April 20. In Ramadan, Muslims commemorate the revelation of the Qur'an, and fast from food and drink during the sunlit hours as a means of drawing closer to God and cultivating self-control, gratitude, and compassion for those less fortunate. Ramadan is a month of intense spiritual rejuvenation with a heightened focus on devotion, during which Muslims spend extra time reading the Qur'an and performing special prayers. For Muslims, Ramadan is a time to train themselves both physically and spiritually by avoiding any negative acts such as gossiping, backbiting, lying, or arguing. Muslims welcome Ramadan as an opportunity for self-reflection and spiritual improvement, and to grow in moral excellence. Ramadan is also a highly social time as Muslims invite each other to break fast together and meet for prayers at the mosque. At the end of Ramadan, Muslims celebrate one of their major holidays called Eid ul-Fitr.
