It includes many collections curated by topic so our students can move straight to the information both you and they want. One feature to consider assigning in your classes are the [Hot Topics](#). Every month NewsBank looks at the biggest topics in the news in categories like social issues, science and technology, economics, or government. If it is trending, you will find the latest research with the click of a mouse. Headlines like the [failed Japanese rocket launch](#) open to numerous (in this case 359) articles students can use to understand current events.

As part of our [International Year](#), this week we are celebrating [Ramadan](#). While not part of a specific country's culture, it is celebrated by 24% of the world population. Ramadan is based on the lunar calendar, so the dates are different every year. For 2023 it is from March 22 through April 20. In Ramadan, Muslims commemorate the revelation of the Qur'an, and fast from food and drink during the sunlit hours as a means of drawing closer to God and cultivating self-control, gratitude, and compassion for those less fortunate. Ramadan is a month of intense spiritual rejuvenation with a heightened focus on devotion, during which Muslims spend extra time reading the Qur'an and performing special prayers. For Muslims, Ramadan is a time to train themselves both physically

and spiritually by avoiding any negative acts such as gossiping, backbiting, lying or arguing. Muslims welcome Ramadan as an opportunity for self-reflection and spiritual improvement, and as a means to grow in moral excellence. Ramadan is also a highly social time as Muslims invite each other to break fast together and meet for prayers at the mosque. At the end of Ramadan, Muslims celebrate one of their major holidays called Eid al-Fitr.
