Dear Dr. Campion:

The following action regarding your institution was taken by the Board of Trustees of the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools Commission on Colleges (SACSCOC) during its meeting held on June 13, 2019:

The SACSCOC Board of Trustees continued accreditation following the review of the institution's new off-campus instructional sites in Texas: Stephenville High School, Stephenville; Lingleville High School, Lingleville; Gorman High School, Gorman; Eastland High School, Eastland; DeLeon High School, DeLeon; May High School, May; Dublin High School, Dublin; Brownwood High School, Brownwood; Comanche High School, Comanche; Zephyr High School, Zephyr. The institution is requested to submit a Monitoring Report due **April 1, 2020**, addressing the visiting committee's recommendations applicable to the following referenced standards of the *Principles of Accreditation*:

**Standard 8.2.a (Student outcomes: educational programs), Recommendation 2**

*This standard expects an institution to identify expected student learning outcomes, assess the extent to which it achieves these outcomes, and provide evidence of seeking improvement based on analysis of the results for each of its educational programs.*

The institution did not adequately identify appropriate expected outcomes, assess the extent to which it achieves these outcomes, and provide evidence of seeking improvement based on analysis of the results in the area of student learning outcomes for each of its educational programs.

The institution's revised assessment process is in its infancy. The institution should submit an additional report that clearly states expected outcomes, assesses those outcomes, and provides evidence of seeking improvement based on the results.

**Standard 13.7 (Physical resources), Recommendation 3**

*This standard expects an institution to ensure adequate physical facilities and resources, both on and off campus, that appropriately serve the needs of the institution's educational programs, support services, and other mission-related activities.*

The institution did not adequately demonstrate that it ensures adequate physical facilities and resources at the Gorman High School site. Although the institution has made some

improvements, the institution should submit an additional report that clearly demonstrates that the additional planned improvements have been fully implemented to an extent that ensures adequate physical facilities and resources in the welding lab at the Gorman High School site.

Guidelines for the Monitoring Report are enclosed. Since it is essential that institutions follow these guidelines, **please make certain that those responsible for preparing the report receive the document. If there are any questions about the format, contact the Commission staff member assigned to your institution.** When submitting your report, please send **five (5) copies** to your SACSCOC staff member.

Please note that Federal regulations and SACSCOC's policy stipulate that an institution must demonstrate compliance with all requirements and standards of the *Principles of Accreditation (Principles)* within two years following the SACSCOC Board of Trustees' initial action on the institution. At the end of that two-year period, if the institution does not comply with all standards and requirements of the *Principles*, representatives from the institution may be required to appear before the Board, or one of its standing committees, to answer questions as to why the institution should not be removed from membership. If the Board of Trustees determines Good Cause at that time and the institution has not been on Probation for both years during the two-year monitoring period, the Board may extend the period for coming into compliance for a minimum of six months and a maximum of two years and must place the institution on Probation. An institution may be on Probation for a maximum of two years. If the Board does not determine Good Cause or if the institution does not come into compliance within the specified period of time while on Probation, the institution must be removed from membership. (See enclosed SACSCOC's policy, "*Sanctions, Denial of Reaffirmation, and Removal from Membership*," which includes the provision for a determination of Good Cause.)
